American Chemical Society Undergraduate Research Symposium

Saturday, November 17, 2001 Arizona State University

I am pleased to announce that we will jointly host, with the Central Arizona section, a research symposium specifically for undergraduate researchers. Experience in academic research laboratories is clearly valuable for many undergraduate students. However, very few have the opportunity to complete the research process by presenting their results. Until now!

The day-long symposium will consist of poster and oral presentations. Students will be invited to participate from Arizona State University, the University of Arizona, and Northern Arizona University. Students will thus get an opportunity to mix with peers from their sister institutions, in addition to having the opportunity to talk about their research in a friendly environment.

Interested students should to submit a one-paragraph abstract. Based on the abstracts, some submissions will be selected for oral presentation; the others will participate in the poster session. The number and length of the talks will depend upon the number of participants, but each will be a maximum of 30 min. Selections for oral presentation will be based on research subject area (to ensure a balanced program), completeness of the work, and appeal to a general audience. The deadline for submission of abstracts to be considered for an oral presentation is October 15, 2001.

We strongly encourage all undergraduate students doing research to participate in this unique event!


