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11. 2019 Chair's report: Please provide a narrative of the bast year's activity/successes/challenges:*	The 2019 year was overall successful for the local section on almost all fronts. From an educational perspective, our section hosted Chemistry Olympiad testing at our local university and organized/spoke at a Science Café for the International Year of the Periodic Table. In addition, the local section, with some support from the Union of Concerned Scientists, initiated a Science Advocacy Workshop intended to serve as a source of education as to how to advocate for science, get involved with the local government or how to find equitable and inclusive solutions to problems. From an outreach perspective, we continued our tradition of participating in the National Chemistry Week and Earth Day events; during these events in particular, we impact hundreds and hundreds of students across the section boundaries. From a member engagement perspective, even with the absence of our fourth social event of the year, average member attendance was still increased from 2018. Furthermore, during one of our social events, our section was able to draw participation from a local community college and multiple chemists across Arizona (some up to 300 miles away) to put on the successful event. Moreover we were able to obtain high participation from the Women's Chemistry Group during these social events. From a governance standpoint, we elected a chair for the Education sub-committee. In addition, we again held electronic elections which yielded a high turnout on par with 2018 when the electronic voting was initiated. Overall the biggest challenge our section faced involved membership participation at the member and affiliate levels. The reduced participation made governing difficult at times, especially when impacting the attendance at executive board meetings. Twenty percent of the meeting held in 2019 did not obtain a quorum, directly impeding th ability of the executive board to govern. The lack of membership participation also made it more difficult to fill vacant positions on the executive committee. The potentially most diffi
