Science Advocacy Workshop (Feb 2020)

In conjunction with the Union of Concerned Scientists and the March for Science, the section hosted a Science Advocacy workshop. This workshop was run by one of our own member volunteers, CJ Pommier, and presented techniques to better communicate with our elected officials on Science Policy Issues. The end result was drafting of a letter to Sen. Kyrsten Sinema on science legislation pending before the US Senate.

December Holiday and Awards Reception

Early in December the section held a joint Holiday and Awards Reception. For this event members were asked to choose from among three holiday snacks that were delivered to their doors (thank you Prime!). The event itself consisted of a virtual social time like we normally used to do live, followed by presentation of awards for High School Teacher of the year- Ty White, High School Chemistry Teacher at Willcox High School received the 2020 High School Chemistry Award from SAZACS and the Regional High School Award to the Rocky Mountain Region of ACS. College Educator of the year went to Duane DeSpain, Chemistry Faculty from Eastern Arizona College. Brooke Beam-Massani received the H.
